Cole suggested that a two-hour time frame is suitable depending on discussion and public input

Bare suggested following Robert's Rule of Order and would not be in favor of any time limits

Green suggested 90-minute time frame for target goal

Morrisette echoed 90 minutes.

Blackledge suggested a framework of time to be respectable to staff

Carr suggested 90 to 120 minutes time frame for the meeting

McKnight questioned if the committee were to be bound to the 90-minute time frame

Chairperson noted that he would regulate the time

Bare requests for members to be able to submit agenda items moving forward

Kopytchak wanted clarification on Bare's opinion

Blackledge suggested that there was a consensus among members for the chair/co-chair to formulate the meeting agenda

A motion was made by Blackledge, seconded by Morrisette, that this Action Item be Approved. The motion carried by the following vote:

Kopytchak mentions Robert's Rule is strict and requests an open dialogue

Cole moves to adopt a 3-5 minute time frame

McKnight does not think that there should be a time limit

Green expressed support for leaving time open for committee members 30:00

Durant calls for 5-minute time frame with the ability to clarify if more time is needed

Cole agrees with 5-minute time frame

Bare does not support any set time limits of committee members, unless under Robert's Rule of Order

Morrisette expresses that there should not be a limit for committee members

A motion was made by Bare, seconded by McKnight, that this Action Item be Approved. The motion carried by the following vote:

Buchanan asked staff for a full report from Lakeview Center on mental health of PPD officers.

- Prioritization of Proposed Targeted Items (in no order)
 - a. Citizens Police Academy/Ride Along
 - b. Requirements/Incentives for local police officers.
 - c. Mental health/wellness of citizens and police officers.
 - d. Electronic police complaint forms. Portability.
 - e. When “charges” are brought up against someone, the same intensity and systemic public display should be publicized of the final disposition. Many of the charges do not stick. This will prompt a pause or more thought-provoking measures before “mounting charges” against individuals.
 - f. The process of charges/arrest.
 - g. Issuance of Citations or "ticket" rather than charges.
 - h. More training on temperance vice tacticalness. Romeo vs. Rambo.
 - i. Community oriented policing - trust building.
 - j. Additional resources for citizens and youth.
 - k. Criminalized homelessness.
 - l. Law Enforcement grading system.
 - m. Arrestable offenses - database.
 - n. Attrition of police officers.
