FIRST LEROY BOYD FORUM

Gloria Horning: Addressed Council regarding flooding in her neighborhood impacting her home and other personal property. She referenced FEMA funds awaiting to be granted for the raising of her home but indicated there are unanswered questions from the City holding up the process.

Council Member Wiggins inquired if there is an update available for Dr. Horning with Mayor Reeves indicating he will follow up with staff. Council Member Wiggins requested the update be sent to Council Executive Kraher to be forwarded.

Additionally, he asked questions of Dr. Horning.

Ellis Jones: Addressed Council regarding a parking ticket he received which he disagrees with the application of the regulation related to the proximity of railroad signage he allegedly violated. He urged the City to develop a policy or ordinance to address such issues.

Mayor Reeves indicated he will ask staff to follow-up with Mr. Jones.

Jewel Cannada-Wynn: addressed Council regarding the development of attainable housing and referred to action taken by Council (when she was a member of Council) with a goal of five hundred (500) homes in five (5) years. She referenced Malcolm Yonge Gym property (900 East Jackson Street) which has been identified for attainable housing and not to lose sight of (that) commitment. Further, she encouraged the Mayor and Council to develop a policy to address housing needs in the City.

Sherri Myers: Addressed Council regarding her efforts (when she was a member of Council) to address the issue of how the City hires legal services. She referenced that currently there is not a City Attorney but a contract with Beggs & Lane to provide legal services and that City Council did not vote to approve the contract. Further, she finds it disturbing the Council hasn't hired its own attorney and that the City Attorney position shouldn't be unfilled as long as it has.

Council Member Broughton referenced Ms. Cannada-Wynn's comments regarding the City's efforts over the last several years to address affordable housing and would like to review such records to learn about decisions made over time.

Cris Dosev: Addressed Council providing an update on General Daniel "Chappie" James, Jr. Memorial Plaza and monument related to funding.

Brian Wyer: Addressed Council representing the Gulf Coast Minority Chamber of Commerce and expressed gratitude for the recent workshop held in conjunction with City staff on *How To Do Business with the City*. He thanked City Administrator Fiddler and Council Member Wiggins for their attendance.

Council President Jones thanked everyone for bearing with him as he presided over his first meeting. He also wished everyone Happy Holidays.

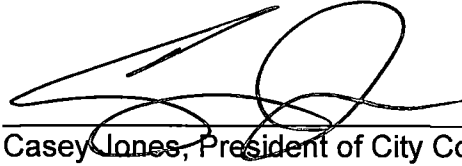
